City Web Site: The new city website has been up and running and electronic payments are being made almost every day. We have received very favorable comments about the web site. It is our goal to post new articles at least once a week. There are still places within the website needing attention/completion. Annual Audit: The annual audit process took place on August 8th & 9th. Once the information is compiled Accuity LLC will appear before council to give a complete report on their findings.

November and December Council Meeting: I would like to recommend combining the November and December City Council Meeting due to the manner in which various holidays fall this year. I will speak more to this issue at the council meeting in August.

Obria Medical Clinics: Late last week the Obria medical Clinic contacted me asking to relocate their Medical Mobile Unit from the parking lot of the Scio Baptist Church to the "parking lot in front of the Mid-Willamette Family Medicine Clinic. The reason for the location is to give the Medical Mobile Unit more visibility. The Medical Clinic has no objections and supports the location of the unit.

In speaking with the CEO of Obria Medical Clinics, Debbie Tracy, I stated that I did not see anything prohibiting the relocation of the unit so long as the street leading into the residents located behind the Mid-Willamette Clinic was not blocked and so long as the Scio City Council approved.

Public Right-of-Way Ordinance: The Public-Right-of-Way Ordinance will be on the September 10, city council agenda.
